About Our School

École de Sutton School is a joint venture between *Commission scolaire du Val-des-Cerfs* (CSVDC) and Eastern Townships School Board (ETSB). The students of Sutton School travel on the same school buses, share the same cafeteria, library, gymnasium and playground, and participate in the same extra-curricular activities. The teaching and support staff are hired by their respective Boards, but the Principal is responsible for both. This school model is consistent with the thinking of the people of this area. The school reflects the values of the Sutton community.

COMMUNITY RELATIONS

The school is definitely at the heart of the Sutton community. It symbolizes the harmony that exists between the two linguistic groups who live and work together in our small community. Many of our facilities are shared with the Town of Sutton. The school has priority in the gym during the week until 5 p.m. After that time, during the week and the weekends, it is a Town of Sutton facility, within the jurisdiction of the municipality. Many sports activities such as yoga, basketball, volleyball and badminton are available to adults. As well, classes in different dance disciplines and opti-basketball are available for our elementary students.

Our beautiful library is also a shared facility with a library supervisor and many volunteers from our community. Only school students have use of this facility from 8 a.m. to 10 a.m., and then it is open to the public. In the 2009-2010 school year, our students borrowed 7,719 books. We also receive different grants each year for the purchase of new library books. There are also numerous computers available for students and the public.

Everyone in the community benefits from the school and the school benefits from our community's involvement.
