Organizers are calling this past weekend's Lennoxville High School Reunion a success after 117 former students and staff members made it out at one time or another over the weekend. Travelling with 26 spouses or significant others in tow, the LHS alumni came as far away as Peru, Kentucky, Alabama, New Hampshire, British Columbia, Ontario, New Brunswick, and Nova Scotia to reminisce and reunite.



"It was good," shared reunion participant and organizing committee member Linda Hoy, saying that although not as many people came as were expected, the turnout was still a great success.

According to Hoy the weekend began with a meet and greet event at the Bishop's University campus pub on Friday evening.

On Saturday morning the doors of what is now known as Lennoxville Elementary School were opened up for all the visitors to walk the old halls.

"Many stories were told of a time when most were young and could run up the stairs two at a time," Hoy shared.

A memorial service was held to commemorate and share the names of those who had passed away since the last reunion in 2013. The names of the lost were read and candles lit to remember them, after which a memorial bench that was made by the Lennoxville Vocational Training Centre and friends was donated to the school and dedicated to the memory of former classmates and teachers of Lennoxville High School.

Activities continued, with Golf being Former Lennoxville High School teachers Gwendolyn Conner Mcknight, David Cochrane and Ann Olney Belden. played by a few in North Hatley while others toured Grace Village, Uplands, the Malvern Cemetery, and the Hyatt One Room School House.

Sunday morning a farewell brunch was held at the A.N.A.F (HUT) when everyone had the chance to say farewell.
