Minister visits Sunnyside

The grade 5 and grade 6 students of Sunnyside Elementary School received an important visitor to their class on Monday afternoon: the Minister of International Development and La Francophonie, and the MP for Compton-Stanstead, the Honourable Marie-Claude Bibeau. Planned by the Minister's office, the visit gave the students, who prepared their questions in advance, a chance to learn about Ms. Bibeau's role as a Canadian Minister and as a Member of Parliament.

"The students asked a lot of questions about my travelling, such as what is the farthest country I have travelled to and what is the scariest country I have travelled to. They also asked why I decided to enter politics and what I would have done if I didn't win," said Minister Bibeau in an interview with the Stanstead Journal after

the event. Sunnyside was the third elementary school to receive this kind of informal visit from the Minister and she intends to visit more elementary schools in the future.

Over the weekend it was announced that Prime Minister Justin Trudeau would be bringing his cross-country 'listening tour' to Sherbrooke Tuesday evening. People wishing to attend the town hall meeting could register on line on a first come first serve basis. "There are already about three or four hundred people registered; it's filling up fast. The idea of this tour is to hear what the people have to say and to see if the government is in touch with the people," explained Ms. Bibeau. The event took place at the Manege Militaire on Belvedere Street.

The Prime Minister was in Halifax on Monday, visiting Halifax cafés before a meeting that was supposed to take place at the town hall in Dartmouth, but had to be moved to the Dartmouth arena because so many people wanted to attend.
