The suggested activities are varied and easy to use for children of all grade levels, enabling them to retain what they have already learned and stay motivated to keep on learning. Each student can map out their own path in every subject.

New activities will be added regularly to help students enjoy every day of learning, and very soon there will also be activities designed for children with specific needs.

Please note that the purpose of this platform is to provide parents with tools to support their children's daily learning, should they find this useful. These exercises are not mandatory and will not be evaluated.

Starting the week of April 6, you will also receive a weekly educational activities package containing suggestions for learning activities for all grade levels, from preschool through all cycles of elementary and secondary school.

Some parents have expressed a desire to retrieve pedagogical material from school in order to facilitate their child's learning. The school network is currently working to make this possible, within the guidelines of the public health department. I therefore ask that you refrain from going to your child's school at this time. Please wait for instructions, which will be sent to you at a later date.

In closing, I hope you have an opportunity to spend some meaningful time exploring the Open School platform with your children and engaging in your other family activities.
