GOING BACK TO CLASS IS AN IMPORTANT STEP FOR YOUR CHILDREN. WE WILL BE THERE TO SUPPORT THEM BY OFFERING:

New review, remedial and homework assistance services

An additional \$20 million available to schools for new activities to support and guide students as they go back to class, and to consolidate their learning

For example, your child's school could decide to:

- increase the availability of homework assistance services
- increase the availability of teachers to offer tutoring at school
- · organize review and remedial activities
- increase the availability of specialized resources

WE WILL GIVE MORE SUPPORT TO STUDENTS WITH LEARNING DIFFICULTIES

For students with learning difficulties, such as dyslexia, a language disorder, autism spectrum disorder or attention deficit disorder with or without hyperactivity:

- · increased individualized follow-up
- adjustment of support measures throughout the school year, based on needs

Hundreds of thousands of hours of additional direct services for students with handicaps, social maladjustments or learning difficulties

Specialists' time fully devoted to the needs of students with handicaps, social maladjustments or learning difficulties, thanks to the relaxation of administrative procedures

New complementary tools for distance learning

- \$1.3 million for the production of 200 original educational videos, featuring actual teachers and broadcast on television and online by SAVOIR MÉDIA
- Extended access to the Open School educational resources online platform <u>ecoleouverte.ca/en</u>





More resources and more time for students

- \$18.7 million for an additional 350 new classroom teachers, resource teachers, psychologists, psycho-educators, speech therapists and other professional resources, or additional full-time support
- Over 700 new resources already hired last year
- The equivalent of 2.5 additional days per week of technical or professional services in each elementary and secondary school

The creation of 75 new special classes

- \$7.3 million for the creation of 75 new classes
- 200 new resources to provide services tailored to students with specific needs, including increased professional support to meet the needs of many students who are particularly vulnerable

Support for encouraging students to stay in school

An additional \$10 million to support organizations working to encourage dropouts to go back to school, especially those who may have dropped out because of the pandemic

Better access to extracurricular activities and help with homework

- An additional \$41 million to offer more sports, cultural and science activities at school
- More homework assistance services, a key factor in the educational success of many students

TIME SCHEDULED FOR REINFORCING STUDENTS' LEARNING

- Time will be allotted at the start of the school year to reinforce students' learning
- Certain concepts that should have been acquired last year will be covered throughout the new school year, as the teacher sees fit
- If you notice that your child has fallen significantly behind in their school work, do not hesitate to contact their teacher



SPECIAL ATTENTION WILL BE GIVEN TO STUDENTS WHO:

- have learning difficulties, so that they receive remedial services adapted to their needs
- are going through a transition, such as those who have been promoted from Grade 6 to Secondary I (help with stress management, adjusting to a new schedule, etc.)
- were in the Grade 6 intensive English program and did not have an opportunity to cover the content in the subjects set out in the *Basic school regulation*
- are attending French school but whose mother tongue is not French, to enable them to review, reinforce and increase their knowledge of French so that they are able to learn the material taught in the various subjects; efforts will also be made to improve communications between the school and the families of these students

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
