Pedagogical Services

Report Cards and Ministry Transcripts

The final report card is a sign that summer is at our doorstep. Term 2 results will be posted on the portal July 4th for Elementary students, and no later than July 10th for High School students, in order to coincide with the availability of Ministry transcripts. Please note that the Student Portal will be shut down from June 13th – June 30th, while marks are being entered.

For parents of students in Secondary 4 and 5, students may access Ministry of Education (MEQ) transcripts and diplomas online through the Online Services section (top right corner) of the MEQ's website: http://www.education.gouv.qc.ca/en/home/. You will be asked to create a student account and in order to do so, you will need your child(ren)'s permanent code and student ID number. These can be found on your child's report card (only one account can be created for each permanent code). We strongly encourage you to create the account(s) prior to the end of the school year. Results from the MEQ will be available as of July 5th 2022. It is also possible to request a revision of Ministry exam marks on this site. If you encounter any technical difficulties in creating or consulting student accounts, you may access the following general support services at the Ministry of Education: 1-866-747-6626 or by clicking on the "Contact MEQ" section on the MEQ website.

Summer School and Ministry Exam Retakes

Students in Secondary 4 and 5 who wish to retake Ministry exams in the following subjects, may do so by registering at 819-868-3100, ext 55110, prior to July 20th 2022.

Exam retake dates are:

Math – Secondary 4 (July 28th)

Science - Secondary 4 (July 29th)

English Language Arts – Secondary 5 (July 25th, 26th, 27th)

French as a Second Language (programme de base) – Secondary 5 (July 22nd and August 1st)

French as a Second Language (programme enrichi) – Secondary 5 (August 1st and 2nd)

Preparatory sessions for these exams, as well as the History Secondary 4 course, are available online through LEARN Quebec, from **July 11th to the 22nd** (Cost \$250, of which \$100 will be covered for eligible students by the ETSB). School & Community partners have teamed up to give away quality English books this summer for Richmond, Danville & Drummondville area High School students (RRHS and the soon-to-be High School students from St. Francis, DES and ADS)!

Sunnyside Elementary School and its many partners have seen a huge success in the development and implementation of Stanstead's very first school-community garden.


Given our focus on sustainability and longevity, much thought has been put in choosing infrastructures that will last, as well as developing partnerships.

The Jardin Sunnyseed Garden is meant to be a place for all to share, in respect of nature and each other. Ten raised garden beds have been installed in a large, fenced area. Four beds are being shared with community members, offering them a place to grow their own food. The vegetables grown in the garden area are reserved for the community and the school. In the fall, students will harvest and transform their crops, filling their bellies with healthy food. As the program develops, we aim to share our excess crops with organizations supporting low-income individuals.

Mélanie Banville, Garden Coordinator will regularly be present at the garden all summer. She is responsible for ensuring the care of the garden grounds and school plots. Of course, this is not a one woman show, Mélanie will most likely need some help at one point or another.
