

# **Pedagogical Services**

### Terms, Communications and Report Cards

For the 2022–2023 school year, the Ministry of Education has mandated the return of 3 terms. The following dates have been set at the Eastern Townships School Board:

**End of Term 1 - November 2, 2022**, with report cards available on the portal on Nov 14th 2022. This term is weighted at 20% of the year's final mark.

**End of Term 2 - January 27, 2023**, with report cards available on the portal on Feb 8th 2023. This term is weighted at 20% of the year's final mark.

**End of Term 3 - June 23, 2023**, with report cards available on the portal on June 30th 2023. This term is weighted at 60% of the year's final mark.

As parents, you will also receive a first communication from your child's school, with information on his/her progress, by October 14th 2022.



#### **COVID Update**

This message is a follow-up to the general COVID information you received at the beginning of the year.

<u>Please take the time to read the rules currently in place for COVID, isolation and masking.</u> While it is true that we do not have mandatory masking in schools, **there are still situations where the government asks that you wear a mask.** This includes a period of up to 10 days after you develop symptoms or test positive, and if you are a household contact of someone who has symptoms or tested positive.

For example, a household contact (typically anyone living under the same roof) of someone who has COVID is supposed to do the following for up to 10 days:

- •Watch for the appearance of symptoms;
- Avoid contact with vulnerable people;
- Wear a mask during any social interaction (except for children aged 5 years and under);
- •Keep a distance of 2 metres, when possible.

This means that if your child has COVID and they have **a sibling attending school**, the sibling would be subject to these public health recommendations.

Please also note that, in the presence of symptoms, a single negative rapid test result is not considered enough to avoid self-isolating. If you have symptoms, you should test yourself with a rapid at-home test. If the test is negative, you should still remain at home and assume you may have COVID, and re-test 24 hours later. If the second test is also negative, then you can resume normal activities. Full information can be found here.

We absolutely do not want to affect the school attendance of students who are not COVID positive, which is why household contacts are not required to fully isolate. However, the government recommends taking the above precautions to help limit the spread just in case.
