Solar Eclipse 2024



For the first time in decades, Eastern and Atlantic Canada will find themselves cast beneath the shadow of the Moon on April 8, 2024. As the Moon passes directly between the Earth and the Sun, it will create a total solar eclipse, completely blocking the Sun from view for a few spectacular minutes. This is truly a once-in-a-lifetime event for Ontario, Quebec and the Atlantic provinces, as the next total solar eclipse over eastern Canada will be in 2079, and in 2106 after that!

• IEPs (Individual Education Plans)

We were very fortunate to have Kymberley Morin, teaching principal at Mansonville Elementary School and former Special Education Pedagogical Consultant, offer an information session to parents on IEPs. • Educational Pathways
